Home Remedies for When Your Pet Gets Sick

It's clear that many don't hold back when it comes to caring for their pets. Americans will spend \$47 billion on our furry friends this year alone.

But what happens when your pet gets sick and you can't get to a vet? There

are some quick fixes you can probably find in your own home.

Veterinarian Melissa Webster from the Tampa Veterinary Hospital says if you can't get to a vet and your pet has a cut, grab your baking supplies. "Flour or corn starch can be a product that you can apply to a wound that will help coagulate the blood a little bit," said Webster.

Did your dog eat something that he shouldn't?

"Your pet ate a whole bunch of say chocolate, for instance, because chocolate can be toxic for dogs. I would highly suggest you get some hydrogen peroxide and give that to the pet until he vomits," said Webster.

As far as human medications, Benadryl is safe for pets with allergic reactions, one milligram per pound. "So a 50 pound dog would take two tablets or a 50mg dose in other words," said Webster.

"Pepto-Bismol is also safe in small doses".

So What are Some Doggy and Kitty Don'ts?

"I think as veterinarians, we say please don't give your cat Tylenol because you won't have that cat in the morning," said Webster.

Any form of ibuprofen, acetaminophen or aspirin can be deadly.

One pet myth is that olive oil makes their coats shine and look healthy. Vets say that's false — oil can actually cause pancreatitis in pets.

Experts say nothing replaces a visit to the vet, and if you're unsure of a home remedy, call one before trying to treat your pet yourself.

Actions You Can Take For a More Humane Community!

- 1 Call your U.S. Senators when there is pending animal protection legislation that needs support.
- **2** Vote for animal friendly candidates at the city, county, state and federal level.
- **3** If you see animal cruelty in your community, report it to your local police department and animal control. To not report it is to be as guilty as the abuser.
- **4** Write a letter to the editor of your local newspaper urging readers to support animal protection legislation.
- **5** Spay or neuter your pets to help reduce the number of homeless dogs and cats.
- **6** Adopt a pet from your local shelter to save the life of a homeless animal.
- **7** Shop with compassion. Always buy cosmetics free of animal testing and garments and accessories free of fur or fur trim. If you are not sure, ask or don't buy.
- **8** Find out how your legislators voted on animal protection issues. You can visit the Humane Society Legislative Fund at www.hslf.org to find out.


